A LETTER OF CONDOLENCE IS TO BE SENT TO THE FAMILY OF PAT MALONEY, SR. EXPRESSING TO THEM THE SYMPATHY OF THE COURT ON THE LOSS OF THEIR LOVED ONE. FROM HUMBLE ORIGINS MR. MALONEY ROSE TO THE TOP OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION. HE WAS REGARDED AS ONE OF THE BEST TRIAL ATTORNEYS IN THE COUNTRY BY THE BEST TRIAL ATTORNEYS IN THE COUNTRY. HIS COURTROOM SKILLS WERE LEGENDARY. HE OFTEN STATED THAT HE HAD A GREAT ADVANTAGE OF BEING BORN POOR AND RAISED ON THE SOUTHSIDE OF SAN ANTONIO. THIS GAVE HIM AN EVERLASTING EMPATHY FOR THE LESS FORTUNATE. HE WAS A PRODUCT OF THE DEPRESSION AND AN IRISH IMMIGRANT FATHER WHOSE EFFORTS TO ORGANIZE LABOR CAUSED RUN-INS WITH THE KKK. MR. MALONEY JOINED THE MARINES WHEN HE WAS 17 AND FOUGHT IN THE GREAT WAR@WORLD WAR II. HE WAS WOUNDED IN COMBAT SEVERAL TIMES; HE WAS AT IWO JIMA WHEN THE UNITED STATES FLAG WAS RAISED. HE RECEIVED TWO PURPLE HEARTS FOR VALOR. AFTER THE WAR MR. MALONEY MOVED TO AUSTIN AND ENROLLED IN THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS. HE SOON BECAME EMBROILED IN CAMPUS POLITICS AND WAS BRANDED A

RADICAL FOR HIS EFFORTS TO ABOLISH FRATERNITIES. HE JOINED IN EVERY CLUB THAT WOULD HAVE HIM AND BECAME PRESIDENT OF MANY. HE STARTED TO WRITE FOR THE DAILY TEXAN. IT WAS THE START OF A LIFE LONG LOVE AFFAIR WITH JOURNALISM , JOURNALISTS AND ALL THINGS CONNECTED WITH WRITING. ACROSS CAMPUS, AN EQUALLY REBELLIOUS YOUNG WOMAN WAS STORMING THE BARRICADED MALE DOMINATED FIELD OF LAW. SHE WANTED TO GO TO LAW SCHOOL. THE SCHOOL WOULDN'T HEAR OF IT. THE STORY INTRIGUED MR. MALONEY AS DID THE WOMAN PROVOKING THE CONTROVERSY. THE ADMINISTRATION RELENDED AND LET OLIVE BOGER ENROLL IN LAW SCHOOL. MR. MALONEY WAS QUICK TO FOLLOW. THE TWO BECAME A COUPLE AND MARRIED SHORTLY AFTER GRADUATION. MR. MALONEY AND HIS WIFE MOVED TO SAN ANTONIO, A CITY HE LOVED, AND HE GOT A JOB AT THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE. BY THE TIME HE WAS 28 HE HAD TRIED OVER 100 FELONY CASES. HE WAS GAINING A REPUTATION AS A MAVERICK IN THE COURTROOM. AFTER AN UNSUCCESSFUL BID FOR DISTRICT ATTORNEY, HE DECIDED IT WAS TIME TO TURN HIS ATTENTION TO THE CIVIL SIDE OF LAW. THINGS WERE PRETTY ROUGH FOR THE FIRST TWENTY FIVE YEARS. THAT'S HOW LONG IT TOOK TO LEVEL THE PLAYING FIELD. BUT LEVEL THE PLAYING FIELD HE DID BY OBTAINING THE FIRST \$100,000 VERDICT EVER RENDERED IN BEXAR COUNTY, THEN THE FIRST \$1,000,000 VERDICT IN THE UNITED STATES. MR. MALONEY'S GENEROSITY WAS AS LEGENDARY AS HIS TRIAL ANTICS. EVERY DAY HIS OFFICE LOBBY WAS FILLED TO CAPACITY WITH PETITIONS FOR HELP. RARELY WAS ANYONE TURNED AWAY. HIS FONDEST ASSOCIATION WAS WITH THE CATHOLIC CHURCH AND THE CLERGY, MANY OF WHOM BECAME HIS BEST FRIENDS. HE WAS A LIFELONG AFFILIATE. HE ATTENDED 6:00 A.M. MASS AT SAN FERNANDO CATHEDRAL EVERY DAY FOR THIRTY YEARS. HE WOULD ARRIVE AT THE CHURCH BEFORE THE DOORS OPENED, FINALLY, FATHER VIRGIL ELIZONDO BECAME HIS BEST FRIEND AND GAVE HIM THE KEYS TO THE CHURCH SO THAT HE WOULDN'T HAVE TO WAIT IN THE DARK ON THE FRONT STEPS EACH MORNING. MR. MALONEY WAS PROUD TO BE A DEMOCRAT AND A CATHOLIC. HE DIED WITH SUCH GRATITUDE THAT LIFE HAD BEEN SO REWARDING AND GOOD. MR. MALONEY IS SURVIVED BY FIVE CHILDREN, PATRICIA, PAT, MICHAEL, TIM AND JANICE AND FIVE GRANDCHILDREN.
