Mr. Negley attended primary school in San Antonio and graduated from Phillips Exeter Academy in 1932. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Texas in 1935, attended the University of Texas Law School and was admitted to the Texas Bar Association in 1937. He practiced law with the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey in the United States and Venezuela until he volunteered for military service in 1942. Upon discharge he founded, with the help of his father-in-law Lutchter Brown, a paper bag manufacturing plant in Monroe, Louisiana. He sold the company to Olin Mathison in 1957 and started a business developing lots and building homes in San Antonio. Some years later he was asked by his father, Richard Negley, to take over management of the Negley Paint Company. He did and operated it very successfully until it was sold in 1985. Mr. Negley was a life board member of the Coastal Conservation Association and in 2000 was named Conservationist of the Year by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission. Mr. Negley is survived by three children, Laura Negley Gill, James Lutchter Negley and Richard Burleson Negley; three step-children; ten grandchildren and nine step-grandchildren; four great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Arredondo was a devoted mother and homemaker whose life was dedicated to her soul mate and husband of 66 years, Ernest, her children, and her wonderful extended family and friends. Arredondo, children Sylvia Shaw, Ernie Arredondo, Michael Arredondo, Jerry Arredondo; eleven grandchildren and eight great grandchildren survive her.

His sister and brother and numerous nieces and nephews survive him.

Mr. Rainey graduated from The Citadel, The Military College of South Carolina, in 1939 and would become a Life Member of the Citadel Alumni Association and a Major Donor to the Citadel Development Fund. He entered the United States Army in 1939 and served in World War II with the Fifth Armored Division as an auto weapons commander for the 387th AAA Battalion. He was awarded the Bronze Star Medal, EAME Theatre Campaign Medal with five Bronze Service Stars, the American Theatre Campaign Medal, and the American Defense Service Medal with one Bronze Service Star and was in the Reserve on the staff of the 36th Division Artillery until 1948. His work was editorialized in the San Antonio Express News in 1976 as being a major factor in the economic development of San Antonio. In 1960, he was an originator of tilt concrete wall construction in San Antonio and he retired in 1984.
