A letter of condolence is to be sent to the family of Ret. District Judge Marvin Teddy Butler expressing to them the sympathy of the court on the loss of their loved one. Judge Butler was a veteran of the United States Army and a graduate of Baylor University School of Law. He had a long and distinguished legal and political career that began in his hometown of Karnes City Texas. Judge Butler practiced law in Karnes County for a number of years with his partner, Judge John May. He was elected Karnes County Attorney in 1952, winning the first of a long series of successful election campaigns. In 1958, Judge Butler was elected as Karnes County Judge, an office to which he was re-elected in 1962. In 1963, he accepted appointment as Assistant U. S. District Attorney and moved to San Antonio. In 1969, he was appointed as the United States District Attorney for the Western District of Texas, Judge Butler was appointed by Governor Preston Smith as the Criminal District Attorney of Bexar County in 1969, a position in which he successfully retained in two contested elections. In 1977, he was appointed by Governor Dolph Briscoe as Judge of the 226<sup>th</sup> District Court in Bexar County, an office he held until his retirement in 1988. He is survived by his children Melinda Beckett, of Comfort, Texas; Richard Butler, of Karnes City, Texas; Julie Beck of San Antonio, Texas; 4 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren; and nieces and nephews.

A letter of condolence is to be sent to the family of Dolores Aguilar Aguirre expressing to them the sympathy of the court on the loss of their loved one. She is survived by her husband of 62 years, Emilio Aguirre; children, Elsa A. Villalpando, Edmund A. Aguirre, Linda Aguirre-Pike, and Reynaldo Aguirre; numerous nieces, nephews and other relatives.
