April Rodriguez, 2013 Senior Class President from Southside ISD gave the invocation at today's meeting. County Commissioner Sergio "Chico" Rodriguez led the Pledge of Allegiance.



A letter of condolence is to be sent to the family of Sylvia Rodriguez expressing to them the sympathy of the court on the loss of their loved one. Her life was driven by her faith and commitment to family and dedication to community and public service, always giving, teaching, loving and leading. She and her husband Gene served as Volunteer Coordinators for the Jimenez Thanksgiving Dinner for almost 20 years and she continued her service organizing and coordinating hundreds of volunteers for many years as Director of the annual San Fernando Health and Safety Fair providing health screenings and medical consultations to thousands of uninsured and undocumented persons without access to health care. Sylvia was a long-time Democratic Party activist who started her career working for State Senator Joe J. Bernal. She played a leadership role in the election of many Democratic Party candidates and was a driving force in campaigns for countless women. She was a key leader of the Mexican American Democrats (MAD) of Texas and was elected to the Democratic National Committee in 1978 where she was the founder and first Chair of its Hispanic Caucus. In 1980 Sylvia was invited by President Jimmy Carter to lead in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance at the Democratic National Convention. Over the years she was a Eucharistic Minister and Lector, a proud member of Las Damas de San Fernando, Political Divas of San Antonio, a founding member and Treasurer of Hispanic Women's Network of Texas, Hispanas Unidas, Women's Employment Network, and board member of the San Antonio Development Agency, San Antonio Port Authority, Parent Child Incorporated, YWCA, Inman Christian Center, Commission for Mexican American Affairs, and Health/Welfare Council of the National Capital Area in Washington, DC often serving an officer or Chair. In 2011, Sylvia was inducted into the San Antonio Women's Hall of Fame for her volunteerism. She is survived by her husband Eugene Rodriguez and daughter Clarissa M. Rodriguez, as well as numerous nieces and nephews and friends.

He is survived by his wife Esmeralda Hernandez, father, Jose Angel Hernandez, Sr., sister, Irma Castillo and brother, Jesus Hernandez, and numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, aunts and uncles.

A letter of condolence is to be sent to the family of Greg J. Ramirez expressing to them the sympathy of the court on the loss of their loved one. He was born in Mexico City and moved with his family to the U.S. at age

6. He lived in many cities throughout his childhood as his father was a professional wrestler and moved the family often. He attended Thomas Jefferson High School and earned extra money for his family playing in bands at local venues. At age 17, he joined Sunny and the Sunglows, a band that earned a great deal of fame throughout the Southwest and Nationally. He loved making music and had many entertaining stories of life on the road with his band. In the early 1960's, he began taking karate lessons at San Fernando Gym under the instruction of Atlee Chittim. He excelled at martial arts, earning his black belt and serving as an instructor. Like music, karate remained a life-long passion for him. In 1987 he took over Southwest Regional Karate Institute and taught hundreds of students, many of whom could not afford tuition, over the next decade. He was actively involved in the United States Karate Alliance, serving as South Texas State Representative, and being inducted into the Atlee Chittim Roll of Honor. He also worked at San Antonio College from 1995 to 2005, assisting students in the Student Support Services office. An excellent student himself, he earned his degrees from SAC and UTSA in Business, Accounting, Psychology, and a Master's in Counseling. He became a Licensed Professional counselor and worked for the Family Service Association from 2006 until the week of his passing. His passion was counseling families, especially young, at-risk children. He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Dolores A. Ramirez, children, Greg Ramirez, Jr., Donna Martinez, Valerie Ramirez, and Charlie Ramirez, 11 grandchildren, as well as 3 great-grandchildren, numerous nieces, nephews and friends.

A letter of condolence is to be sent to the family of Daniel H. Jones expressing to them the sympathy of the court on the loss of their loved one. He was happily retired. He held previous positions as a medical librarian at the Texas Biomedical Institute, UT Health Science Center and the University of South Alabama and served in the Peace Corps in Malaysia. He received his Bachelors of Science degree from Clemson University and his Master's degree from Emory University. He cherished his family, friends, a good glass of wine, and politics. He was a member of the Native Plant Society of Texas and donated many hours to Boy Scout Troop 405 at St. Luke's Catholic Church. He survived by his wife, Rajia Tobia, 2 sons, Andrew and Patrick and other family members.

An expert in aerospace physiology who trained astronauts and flight surgeons, he was an outgoing man brimming with intellect and compassion. He served in World War II and then went to medical school for two years before convinced to rejoin the military to study the effects of high altitudes on the body. It was the right decision. It resulted in a 30-year Air Force career that took his expertise to a variety of bases, including Brooks and Randolph in San Antonio, and Patrick AFB in Florida, where he worked with NASA astronauts on the effects of space flight. He continued working after retirement, first as a nighttime administrator for Metropolitan General Hospital and from 1981 to '83 as headmaster at Antonian College Preparatory High School. Although science was his life, he was an unflinching patriot who saluted whenever he saw an American flag and was thankful for everything he received. He is survived by his wife Elizabeth LaHood Aboud; daughters Sandy Ross, Cathy Morse, Cyndi Wulff and Debra Fox; 10 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.
