Angie Alvarado gave the invocation at today's meeting. County Commissioner Sergio "Chico" Rodriguez led the Pledge of Allegiance.



Judge Wolff asked that a moment of silence be observed in honor and memory of the lives lost on April 15, 2013 Boston Marathon explosion.
