Jose Angel Siller, BiblioTech Branch Manager gave the invocation at today's meeting. County Commissioner Sergio "Chico" Rodriguez led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Duncan Wimpres was a man of many talents and accomplishments. He held both a Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the University of Oregon and a Ph.D. from the University of Denver. He also earned two honorary doctorates. He served as president of Monticello College and Monmouth College in Illinois and Trinity University in San Antonio as well as the internationally known Southwest Foundation for Biomedical Research. He was a Board member of some forty non-profit and profit-making agencies and served as chairman of a number of them including the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association, Mission Road Developmental Center, the Higher Education Council of San Antonio to name a few. Nationally, he was Vice Chairman of the Board of Foreign Scholarship Program, appointed by President Richard Nixon and then appointed for a second term by President Gerald Ford. His civic and social memberships included the Argyle, Confederate Air Force, Mensa, Plaza Club, Quiet Birdman, life trustee of the San Antonio Medical Foundation, a ruling elder of the United Presbyterian Church USA and a member of Sigma Phi Epsilon. As a member of Rotary for 65 years, he served as president of the Rotary Club of San Antonio, and as District Governor of Rotary International District 5840. He also served as Rotary International President's Representative on several occasions and as the President's Information Counselor. He was the point person in bringing the 2001 Rotary International Convention to San Antonio and served as Vice Chairman of the Convention Host Organizing Committee. A veteran of World War II with a Bronze Star for Valor and five major battle stars, he participated in the invasion of Normandy on D-Day and in the Battle of the Bulge. Dr. Wimpres was also a licensed commercial pilot with instrument and multi-engine ratings as well as an avid skier and golfer. He is listed in Who's Who in America, since 1964, Who's Who in the World, Who's Who in the South and Southwest, Who's Who in Science and Engineering, American Men of Achievement, Dictionary of International Biography and Leaders in Education. He is survived by his wife, Peggy, his children, Wendy Huston, Tory Whittier and Gordon D. Wimpres III, his grandchildren, Michael Murphy, Jeffrey Huston, Jonathan Huston, Hilary Whittier, a niece Pat Perry and his great grandchildren, Serenity Young-Huston and Isabelle Huston.

Bill’s passing released a tsunami of his love that swept through San Antonio breaking open hearts, knocking down fences, drowning out conflicts, and cleansing and healing an entire community. He was for many years a member of the San Antonio Zoo Board, and since his retirement, had joined the board of Planned Parenthood Trust of South Texas and volunteered with the Headwaters Conservancy and the San Antonio Area Foundation. He supported many local cultural organizations through both donations and attendance. A lifelong competitive and then recreational swimmer, he also greatly enjoyed taking his dogs for long walks, reading the Express-News thoroughly, drinking coffee, attending the San Antonio Symphony and other local musical performances, cheering for the Spurs, researching family history, and spending time with his family. He loved San Antonio and knew a tremendous amount about its history, both distant and recent. He is survived by his wife and best friend of 43 years, Nancy Salling Diehl; daughters Marley Suzanne Diehl of San Antonio and Audrey Aline Diehl; and grandson Miles Kemper Diehl Wizenburg of Los Angeles; as well as other family members.
