He entered Novitiate on August 17, 1994, in Godfrey, Illinois, and professed vows as a member of the Congregation of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate on August 1, 1995. Fr. Erving completed his studies in theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, Italy in 1999; he was ordained to the priesthood on May 27, 2000, at Immaculate Conception Parish in Towson, MD, by Bishop Michael D. Pfeifer, OMI. Prior to his priestly ordination, Fr. Erving served as Campus Minister and Teacher at St. Anthony Catholic High School in San Antonio, Texas. Fr. Erving's first priestly assignment was as Parochial Vicar at Immaculate Conception Parish in Lowell, MA. He then served in vocation ministry in the Northeast. Fr. Erving also served as Parochial Vicar at Holy Angels Parish in Buffalo, NY; and Our Lady of Refuge Parish in Eagle Pass, Texas. Fr. Erving served as Pastor at Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish in Port Isabel, Texas; and Our Lady of Refuge Parish in Roma, Texas. While in Buffalo, NY, Fr. Erving hosted a radio program on The Station of the Cross Catholic Radio Network. In South Texas, he was very active in the ACTS movement and was a member of the Knights of Columbus, as a third degree Knight. At the request of Bishop Daniel E. Flores, Fr. Erving also served as Director of the Respect Life Apostolate of the Diocese of Brownsville. In addition to his Oblate family, Fr. Erving is survived by his parents, Joseph and Eileen (Tierney) Erving; his sister, Elizabeth Gonzalez and her husband, Rubén Gonzalez; his brother, Daniel Erving and his wife Amy Erving; his nephews, Joseph and Patrick Gonzalez; and his nieces, Annabelle Gonzalez, Grace Erving, and Nora Erving.

Elton Ray Hutchison was a state representative from Dallas from 1973 to 1977, a time when Republicans were rare birds in that body. He became chairman of the Republican Party of Texas in 1976, a job he left to run for governor in 1978. The Republicans elected a governor that year, but it was Bill Clements, who had defeated Hutchison in the primary. Hutchison met his second wife, then known as Kay Bailey, in the House, where both were Republican legislators. After ending his own political career with that 1978 race for governor, he concentrated on his legal work and served as political consigliere to his wife, who ran successfully for state treasurer in 1990 and then won a special election to the U.S. Senate in 1993, when Lloyd Bentsen resigned to become U.S. Treasury secretary. Kay Bailey Hutchison, who unsuccessfully challenged Gov. Rick Perry in the 2010 Republican primary, retired from the Senate in 2013. Ray Hutchison was senior counsel in counsel in the Dallas office of Bracewell Giuliani, well-known as a specialist in government bonding. His client list included the DFW International Airport and DART. He worked on the deal to build what is now the Ballpark at Arlington and on various bond issues for school districts and other governments across North Texas.

A native of San Antonio, he attended St. Henry's Elementary School and later graduated from Central Catholic H.S., class of '53 and then went onto earn his Marketing degree from St. Mary's University, class of '57 at which time he was also commissioned a 2nd Lt. in the U.S. Army. Max proudly served his country for over 11 years including two tours of duty in Vietnam. He came back with many interesting stories about his experiences while there. He attained the rank of Major in Feb 1968. He earned many military awards including 3 Bronze Stars, 2 Army Commendation Medals and the Vietnam Service and Campaign Medals. His last tour of duty was at Ft. Richardson (Anchorage), Alaska where his sixth child was born. Here is where he began his love of the Boy Scout Organization leading his own boys and many others for over 20 years. After 2 ½ years in Alaska he returned to San Antonio and civilian life. His Civil Service years as a Construction Inspector were spent at Ft. Sam Houston and Kelly AFB from which he retired in 1998. He enjoyed fishing, boating, water and snow skiing, golfing, gardening and tackling many do-it-yourself projects. He loved creating fun for himself, family and friends and was especially proud of his home renovations which he designed himself particularly his game room. During his tenure as Cub Master of Pack 445, he was awarded the St. George Medal by the Catholic Committee on Scouting. As an Assistant Scout Master of Troop 445, he was inducted into the Order of the Arrow of Alamo Area Council. A highlight of his scouting years was the horseback trek at Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. He was a devout member of the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church where he was among the first group selected to be Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist. He continued this ministry for 35 years. He was active in the Holy Name Society, where he was designated the Blessed Sacrament Outstanding Holy Name Member in 2007. He also coached in the CYO Baseball Program and helped to build the parish baseball field. Additionally he was active in the Knights of Columbus, ACTS and the VSP. He is survived by his beloved wife of almost 57 years, Margie Petri; their children: Annette Scott (Sam), Ken Petri (Donna), Brian Petri, Danny Petri (Ruby), Andy Petri (Anna-Laura) and Claire Abad (Robert); 16 grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren, as well as other family members and many nieces, nephews and cousins.
