From 2001-2003, she served as president of the San Antonio Area Retired Teachers Association and in 2003, she served as President of the Regina Guild of San Antonio. She was an active member of St. Gregory's Catholic Church from its inception and served as part of the altar society. She is survived by her husband of 63 years, Edgar Fischel; daughter, Yvonne Thompson (Thomas), Linda Fischel, Suzanne Kissling (Joseph); her two sons, Edgar, Jr., and Robert (Tamara); 11 grandchildren, and eight great grandchildren.

He attended Fox Tech High School and San Antonio College. He didn't care to travel or live extravagantly. He enjoyed his home on the west side, and lived there for many years. He is survived by his daughters, Linda De La Cruz (Joe), Mary Perez, Rebecca Perez, Loree Bendel (Barry), and Connie Perez; 9 grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.

She was born in San Diego, Texas and moved to Corpus Christi to attend high school. There she met her husband, Steve of 50 years.
